




STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

Our 10 Year Vision is bearing much fruit. Have you thought of what is going on in the parish and how it is related specifically to the 10 Year Vision that we have here at Corpus Christi? Parish Renewal is possible, but only with a Vision, which is a picture of a preferred future AND a willingness to engage in a lot of hard work!

A brief recap of what has been happening in September. The Youth Ministry, both Senior and Junior sections, met for the launch of a new year of activity. The fruitfulness of the CCYM is the fruit of a clear Vision and the willingness of Youth to step up and lead this growing ministry.

The Seniors have launched for the upcoming year. This ministry is also directing its activities in accord with our Core Values of Evangelical Hospitality, Rooted in Tradition, Engaged Disciples and Multiplying Leaders.

The fall session of Alpha has 65 guests and 40 team members. We also had a hospitality summit that gathered the various groups and ministries, which are involved in hospitality and reviewed the Vision and went over some ways to improve the way things are carried out.

We also have an Evangelization of Parents Committee that has re-launched Heavenly Beans. This is a "reach out" to parents of the school before they pick up their children on Fridays. There is a lot of fruit that is happening with our Vision, for which I am grateful to God and the people who are giving of themselves to Christ and this parish. There is so much more to do.

Many parents are still bringing their envelopes to Mass at the precise time the collection is being taken up, dropping them in the basket and leaving (without shame). I know I cannot eliminate cheating 100%, but I will do what I can to lessen it, make it harder for people to cheat and lie about Mass attendance, so they can get a cheaper rate for school.

Pray the Rosary during this month of October!

我們的十年願景已經結出了豐碩的成果。您是否想過,堂區正在發生的事情與我們這裡聖體聖血堂的十年願景具體相關的地方?堂區的更新是可能的,但只有在有一個願景的情況下,這個願景是一幅優先的未來圖景以及願意投入大量辛勤工作的意願!

九月發生的一些事情的簡短回顧。青少年部別,包括高中和初中部分,為新一年活動的啟動進行了會議。CCYM的成果來自於清晰的願景和青少年願意站出來並帶領這個不斷成長的部門。

長者部門已經為新的一年做好了準備。 這個部門的活動也與我們殷勤款待的福傳、 根植於傳統、投入的門徒和倍增的領袖的核 心價值觀一致。

秋季的 Alpha 課程有 65 名嘉賓和 40 名 團隊成員。我們還舉行了一次款待峰會,召 集了各個參與款待的團體和部門,回顧了願 景並討論了一些改進執行的方法。

我們還有一個家長傳福委員會,重新啟 動了天國豆的活動。這是一項在學校每週五 放學接孩子之前向家長作福傳的活動。 隨著我們願景帶來很多的果實,我為此 感謝天主,也感謝那些為基督和這個堂區奉 獻自己的人。堂區還有很多事情需要做。

許多家長仍然在彌撒進行中收集奉獻的 時候準時到來把信封投入收集籃子裡,然後 離開(不覺羞愧)。我知道我不能 100%消除 這作弊行為,但我會盡我所能來減少它,使 作弊和謊報彌撒出席率變得更加困難,從而 不再讓他們以更便宜的價格上學。

在這十月裡,多誦念玫瑰經!



The Hidden Hierarchy of Angels, According to Saint Thomas Aquinas

You might be familiar with the archangels, but did you know that an entire hierarchy of angels exists in the spiritual realm?

Each of them serves a different purpose.

Saint Thomas Aquinas explained the <u>angelic hierar-chy</u> in his notorious "Summa Theologiae." Each division includes three choirs of angels, and each class of these spiritual beings has a unique role and place. The Church has <u>never issued</u> an official declaration on this. However, it is traditionally seen as a very structured environment.

According to **EWTN**,


"Angels are ranked into nine choirs, or categories, and divided into three hierarchies: seraphim, cherubim, and thrones; dominations, virtues, and powers; principalities, archangels, and angels."

Here are some helpful infographics that summarize this:









I. Highest

Seraphim: They worship God. Seraphim means

"burning love."

Cherubim: "Guardians" of the things of God.

They share deep insight.

Thrones: They carry out God's justice.

II. Middle

Dominions: They rule over the lower angels to carry out God's will and make known His authority.

Virtues: They perform miracles.

Powers: They fight against evil forces.

III. Lower

Principalities: They distribute spiritual goods. **Archangels:** They are God's assistants and fulfill special missions. They also protect the Church.

Angels: They help people reach heaven! Guardian angels protect us from the dangers of body and soul.
