HOW TO AVOID ARGUMENTS ABOUT RELIGION AT FAMILY GATHERINGS



Keep it simple.

You don't need to give long involved explanations in response to questions you get asked. Give a short, concise answer, that is rife with common sense and logic. And you can throw in a little Scripture, too, if you want. You can also do what Jesus often did: answer a question with a question, or questions.

Don't try to convert anyone.

You and I do not convert anyone, that's the Holy Spirit's job. Our job is to simply sow the seeds. So plant seeds. Whether those seeds bear fruit or not...not up to you. You plant the seeds and then you pray.



Don't Get Defensive!

Make them explain what they believe and why they believe it. And, as they attempt to do so, ask them more questions based on what they say. Don't lose your temper; respond with curiosity instead of anger.

Solemnity of Christ the King! Pastor's Corner

As a follow up to the beautiful celebration we had for my 65th birthday and fundraiser for our Capital Campaign debt, the final amount is pretty much settled. There may be amounts coming in after this, but as of now the final, after all expenses is \$126,000. This is just amazing! Once again, I am truly grateful to everyone who worked so hard to put on the event, to everyone who attended and to the generosity of everyone who purchased and donated. Again, \$126,000!!!

This Sunday is the Solemnity of Jesus Christ the King! Jesus Christ is the King of kings, he is the Lord of lords, true God and true Man. In proclaiming this Solemnity, the Church wanted to combat the heresy of atheistic communism that frequently holds up the state as absolute...the "all powerful state." The Church reminds us that we have One, True King who rules over all the universe, this world, our country and our lives. If there is evil in this world it is not because Jesus isn't truly an all-powerful King, but rather because he desires that we freely follow him. Our Lord places such a high premium on freedom that he "risks" us misusing and abusing it and the sad reality is that many do just this. Many do not follow Him; many do whatever they (we) feel like it. This is why we have evil in the world. Today, proclaim Jesus Christ to be your King; proclaim him with your word and with your actions.

There are only a few days left in November. We are going to have our annual Mass on November 30th at 8am, for all those who have died and were buried here from Corpus Christi. As with any Mass everyone is welcome to attend. With the remaining days of November I urge you to pray for the holy souls in purgatory. Offer suffrages for them – suffrages are prayers that are specifically

aimed to assist those souls, known only to God, who are undergoing purification for forgiven sins, but for which sufficient penance was not done. We can assist them; these souls can pray for us, but they can no longer pray for themselves.

Advent is so close, just next week! I will write on this beautiful season that helps us prepare for Christmas. For now, remember this: the season leading up to Christmas is not the Christmas season. It is ADVENT, it is the season provided by the Church to help us prepare for Christmas and the days that proceed from Christmas. Even now, try not to play Christmas music before Christmas day. You might think I'm a "throw-back", but I'm actually just trying to be an accurate Catholic.

基督普世君王節 本堂神父的話

關於我65歲生日慶祝活動及我們資本債務籌款活動，最終金額已基本確定。即使還會有後續款項進來，但截至目前，扣除所有費用後，最終金額是126,000美元。這真令人驚喜！再次感謝所有人的努力，感謝所有參與者，也感謝每一位購買或捐贈者的慷慨支持。再次強調，126,000美元！！！！

這個主日是耶穌基督君王節！耶穌基督是萬王之王，萬君之君，真天主亦真人。在宣佈這個慶節時，教會旨在反對共產主義無神論的異端思想，該思想經常將政權視為絕對的——所謂的“極權國家”。教會提醒我們有一位真正的君王，他統治著整個宇宙、這個世界、我們的國家和我們的生命。如果這個世界中存在邪惡，並不是因為耶穌不是全能的君王，而是因為他希望我們自由地跟隨他。我們的天主重視自由的珍貴，承受讓我們濫用和誤用它的風險，然而悲哀的現實是，許多人確實濫用自由。眾人不跟隨他；許多人(包括我們)做自己想做的事。這就是為何世界會有邪惡的原因。今天就宣告耶穌基督為你的君王；用你的言語和行為來宣告他。

十一月只剩下幾天。我們將於十一月三十日早上八點，為所有在聖體聖血堂安息的亡者舉行每年一次的彌撒。像所有的彌撒一樣，歡迎大家參加。隨著十一月的日子所剩無幾，我敦促大家為煉獄中的靈魂祈禱。為他們代禱——代禱是專門幫助那些只有天主知道的靈魂，正在潔淨已得赦的罪，但補贖未足。我們可以幫助他們；這些靈魂可以為我們祈禱，但他們再也無法為自己祈禱。

將臨期已經很近了，就在下星期！我將會寫一些關於這個美麗的季節，幫助我們準備迎接聖誕節。現在，記住這一點：聖誕節前的這段時間並不是聖誕期。這是將臨期，是教會設立的時期，幫助我們為聖誕節以及聖誕節後的日子做好準備。即便現在，也盡量不要在聖誕節之前播放聖誕歌曲。或許你會覺得我有點“過時”，但其實我只是想做一個準確的天主教徒。

Praying for the poor souls in purgatory is very important! The Church dedicates November to the Holy Souls in Purgatory. She encourages the faithful to offer prayers, indulgences, works of penance, and/or almsgiving for these suffering souls who cannot help themselves.

The [Catechism of the Catholic Church](#) teaches:

“All who die in God’s grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven.” (CCC 1030)

“This teaching is also based on the practice of **prayer for the dead**, already mentioned in Sacred Scripture: ‘Therefore Judas Maccabeus] made atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin.’” (CCC 1032)

“From the beginning, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and **offered prayers in suffrage for them, above all the Eucharistic sacrifice**, so that, thus purified, they may attain the beatific vision of God. **The Church also commends almsgiving, indulgences, and works of penance undertaken on behalf of the dead:**

“Let us help and commemorate them. If Job’s sons were purified by their father’s sacrifice, why would we doubt that our offerings for the dead bring them some

consolation?”

Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them.” (CCC 1032)

Here are five powerful prayers you can say for the Poor Souls in Purgatory, who desperately need our prayers:

1. Deliver Them From Purgatory

My Jesus,
by the sorrows Thou didst suffer in Thine agony in the Garden,
in Thy scourging and crowning with thorns,
on the way to Calvary,
in Thy crucifixion and death,
have mercy on the souls in purgatory,
and especially on those that are most forsaken;
do Thou deliver them from the terrible torments they endure;
call them and admit them to Thy most sweet embrace in paradise.
Amen.

2. Prayer to Have a Merciful Heart Towards Others by Saint Faustina

O Jesus, I understand that Your mercy is beyond all imagining.
I ask You, therefore, to make my heart so big that there will be room in it for the needs of all the souls living on this whole earthly globe.

O Jesus, my love reaches beyond the world to the souls suffering in Purgatory, and I want to exercise mercy toward them by means of indulgenced prayers.

God’s mercy is unfathomable and inexhaustible, just as God Himself is unfathomable. Were I to use the strongest words for expressing this mercy of God, they are nothing in comparison with what it is in reality.

O Jesus, make my heart sensitive to all the sufferings of my neighbor whether they be of body or of soul.
O my Jesus, I know that You act toward us as we act toward our neighbor.

My Jesus, make my heart like unto Your merciful Heart. Jesus, help me to go through life doing good to everyone.

Amen.
