Catholic Undergraduate Science Students

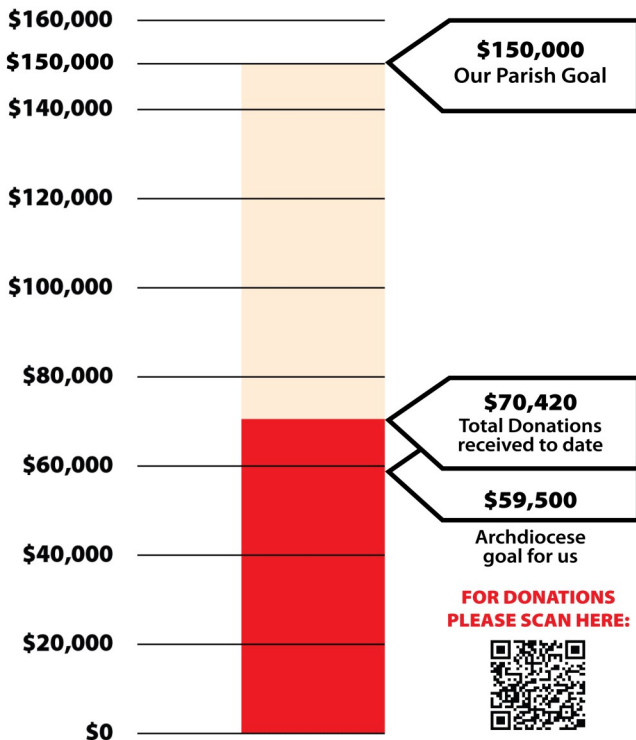

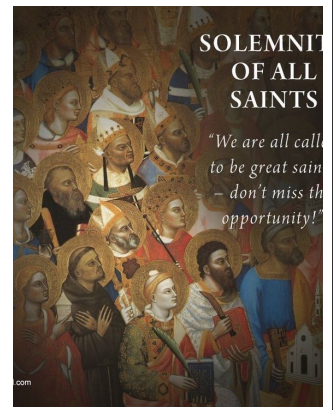


## pastor's Corner

### 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

### 常年期第三十主日

### 神父的話



This coming Thursday is not only the end of October but also Halloween. There are a few things to summarize about Halloween, as many Catholics and Christians disagree on how to observe it:

1. It is the feast of “All Hallows’ Eve.” This is what is most important for us Catholics to remember. The next day is the Solemnity of All Saints. This is the day when the Church gives thanks to God for HIS victory in the lives of the saints – those known and unknown to us.

There is an untold number of souls in heaven. They are what the Epistle to the Hebrews refers to: “Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us.” (Heb 12:1) Celebrating the saints gives glory to God and encourages us to persevere in the race to eternal life. If they reached eternal life with God’s help, then you and I can do it too.

2. It is important to be safe if you are going out in the evening.
3. Some people strive to celebrate this day by either having private parties for their children or, if they go out, having them dress up as saints.

Saturday is All Souls’ Day (Nov 2nd). This is the day when the Church prays – in a special way – for the dead. The Church remembers in her Masses those who have died in Christ and are now undergoing the final purification for their sins (in purgatory), which were forgiven but for which they did not do sufficient penance. Throughout the month of November, strive to remember the holy souls in purgatory in your prayers, rosaries, sacrifices, and mortifications.

1. 這是『諸聖瞻禮前夕』的慶日。對我們天主教徒來說，這是最重要的需要記住的事情。第二天是諸聖節（Solemnity of All Saints）。這是教會向天主感恩的日子，感謝祂在聖人們的生命中的勝利——那些我們知道的和不知道的聖人。

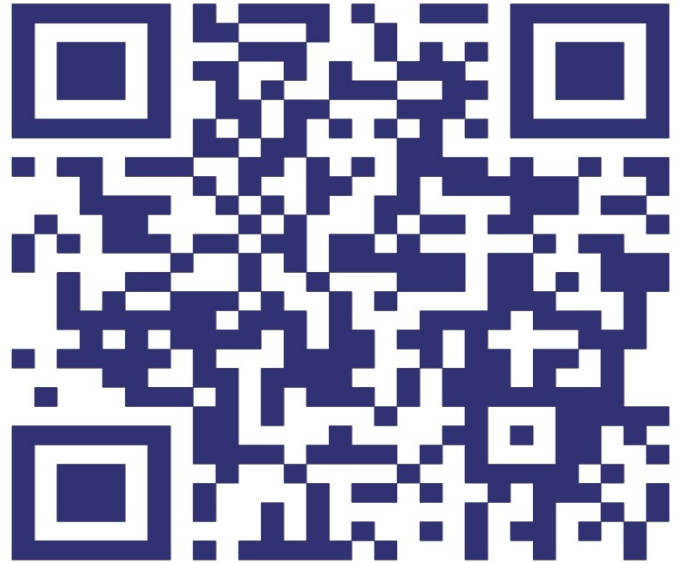
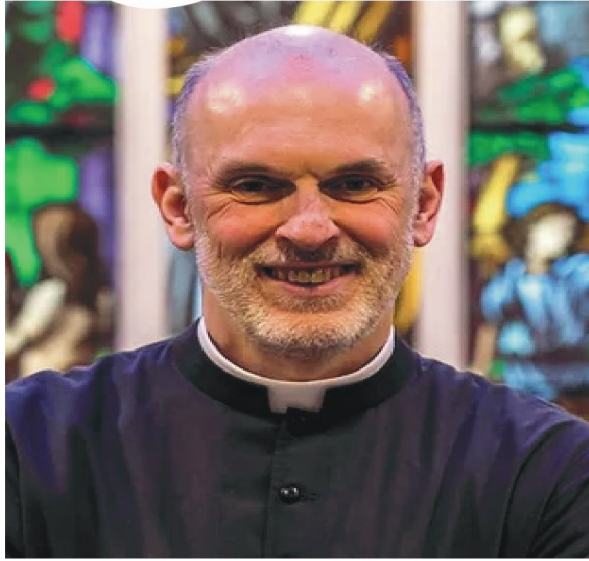
天上有無數的靈魂。這正是《希伯來書》所指的『我們既有這許多的見證人，如同雲彩圍着我們，就當放下各樣的重擔，脫去容易纏累我們的罪，存心忍耐，奔那擺在我們前頭的路程。』（希 12:1）慶祝聖人不僅榮耀天主，也激勵我們堅持不懈，奔向永生的賽程。如果聖人們能夠在天主的幫助下達到永生，那麼你我也能夠做到。

2. 如果晚上要外出，安全很重要。
3. 有些人會選擇為孩子們舉辦私人派對，或者如果要外出，會讓孩子們打扮成聖人的模樣。

星期六是追思已亡瞻禮日（11月2日）。這是教會以特別方式為亡者祈禱的日子。教會在彌撒中紀念那些在基督內逝世的靈魂，並為那些現在正在經歷最終淨化（即在煉獄中的靈魂）祈禱，這些靈魂的罪雖已得到赦免，但他們尚未完成足夠的補贖。在整個十一月份，請在祈禱、玫瑰經、犧牲和克己中，記住在煉獄中的聖靈。

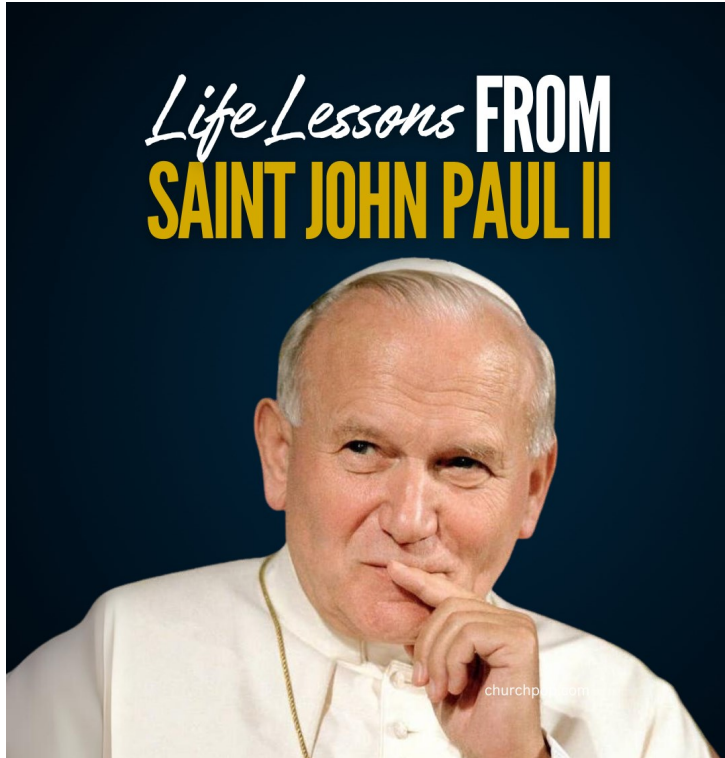

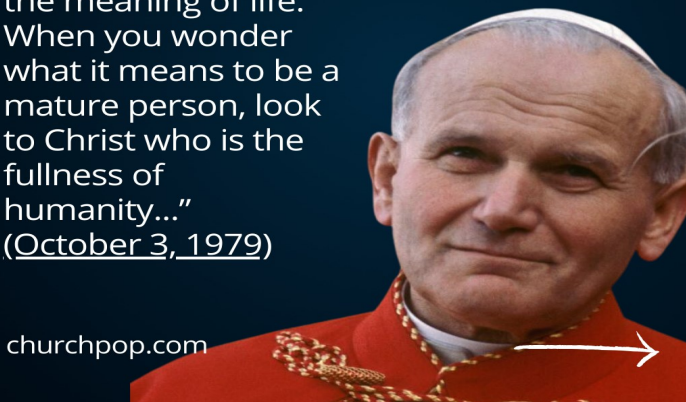
