#### Are You Following God's Will?

## 3 Vital Questions Every Catholic Should Ask Themselves

Are you following God's will? Below are three questions you can ask yourself to be sure!

Are you following God's will?

In <u>this episode</u> of <u>The Catholic Gentleman</u>, John Heinen joins the author of "Finding Peace in the Storm" Dan Burke to discuss how we can more clearly know God's will in our lives.

Below are three questions you can ask yourself to be sure!

1. Are you confusing your desires with divine guidance?

True discernment requires asking ourselves if we are serving God or serving ourselves.

"We can make gods out of our own spirituality and create a whole pseudo-Catholicism that we live in," Burke explains.

He says it's important to check our intentions regularly and seek spiritual direction to make sure our actions align with God's will, not just our desires.

2. Is your peace disturbed by unexpected events?

Life is full of surprises, and not all of them will be pleasant. Aligning our will with God's means trusting that every circumstance, no matter how difficult, is allowed for our good.

"When you are not in peace, you are not with God."

Burke says when we surrender our fears and complaints, we open ourselves up to God's greater plan and the peace that accompanies it.

3. Are you engaging in mental prayer?

Mental prayer is where we come to know Christ personally and hear His voice.

Burke quotes Saint Teresa of Ávila:

"Mental prayer is nothing more than an intimate conversation with a friend."

Without it, he says we risk going through the motions of faith without truly connecting with the God who loves us.

The gentlemen say that even in the uncertainty of our decisions, God's will can be known, and aligning our lives with it is the ultimate victory!

"May your will be done, as in heaven, so also on earth!"

# 5 Ways to Keep Holy the Sabbath Day, in Response to Our Lady of La Salette

"Remember to keep holy Sabbath day. Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord, your God."

Keeping the Sabbath holy is an important aspect of Catholic life!

The <u>Third Commandment</u> states: "Remember to keep holy Sabbath day. Six days you may labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the Lord, your God."

The Blessed Mother focused on this very commandment during an apparition as Our Lady of La Salette.

According to Father Thomas More Garrett,

"On Sept. 19, 1846, Mélanie Mathieu and Maximin Giraud reported having encountered a lady seated along the hillside outside a small hamlet in the French Alps with her face buried in her hands. The 'beautiful lady,' as the children described her, was crying inconsolably. What were the reasons for her tears? When the children approached the lady to inquire, the woman spoke of two great causes that estrange people from her Son — blasphemy and the neglect of the Lord's day.

Like many reported apparitions, Mary did not explicitly introduce herself to the visionaries. Her identity remained a mystery until the context and purpose of her discourse revealed what was left unsaid.

As she continued her conversation with the children, the crying woman expressed her deep concern about the empty pews at Mass on Sunday and the irreverent attitude among those who were present. Many chose work or other activities over worship. Worse yet, those inclined to skip Sunday Mass replaced the words of prayer with vain uses of her Son's name. After making her affection and sentiment known to her young audience, the woman relayed the hope that her message would move many souls to restore a relationship with her Son through more faithful attendance at Mass."

So, how can we keep Sunday as a day set apart for God?

#### 1. Attend Mass.

"It would be easier for the world to survive without the sun than to do without Holy Mass." – Saint Padre Pio

Of course, the best way to keep the Sabbath day holy is to attend Mass.

#### 2. Prepare a Special Meal.


Sunday is a day of celebration. Prepare a special meal as a reminder of Jesus' Resurrection! You can also add a special dessert to your normal meal rotation. There are many ways to involve food as a way to make Sundays stand out.

#### 3. Rest and Reflect.

Rest is so important. Set aside time for an afternoon nap after truly reflecting on the day's Gospel or homily.

#### 4. Engage in Spiritual Reading or Entertainment.

Although there is nothing in the Catechism that prohibits secular entertainment on the Lord's Day, try to focus on books or movies that point your mind to God!



#### 5. Focus Activities Around Family and/or Community.

During the week, our relationships can get pushed to the side. Make time on Sunday to reconnect with loved ones! Call your parents, have a tech-free afternoon with your kids, or get together with fellow parishioners after Mass for donuts.
